When are the Elections?

The voting periods vary according to their type.

Elections are alternated every two years at the national level, the <u>General Elections</u> to elect the President of the United States and the <u>Mid-term Elections</u> to elect Federal Congress and the Governor of Georgia.


Depending on the number of candidates, there may be two or more periods per electoral session.






Intermediate (Mid-term):

Voters elect or re-elect candidates for governor, senators and representatives of the federal congress and some local officials and among other possible positions.

Run-off:

When the minimum number of votes (50% +1) is not reached by any candidate, a new tiebreaker election takes place among the candidates with the highest number of votes.

Especial:

Voting period that take place when it is necessary to substitute an official who has been removed or resigned from his position and there is still a long period of time for the new election to take place.



Important Time Periods in an Election

Registration Deadline to participate in a election.

** The registration of new voters and actualization of registered voter data can occur at any time but before each election there is a deadline by which the voter must be registered to participate in an election.

Early Voting Period



- Generally, they start 3 weeks before the day of the election with schedules from Monday to Friday and the last Saturday before the voting. You can exercise your vote in any open early voting booth depending on the county.
